Blessings

When you think of the word blessing what comes to mind? For many, the word blessing is only a name of the prayer you say right before you eat your meal. For Christians, blessings is something much, much more. In the Nave's Topical Bible the word blessings is defined as *contingent upon obedience and spiritual; from God*. The Lord our God expects us to obey His commandments.

"²⁶See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse - ²⁷the blessing if you obey the commands of the Lord your God that I am giving you today; ²⁸the curse if you disobey the commands of the Lord your God and turn from the way that I command you today by following other gods, which you have not known."

Deuteronomy 11:26-28 (NIV)

You may think this sounds like a very harsh statement from such a loving God. But is it really? Let's reflect upon our childhoods. When you were a child your parents expected you to obey them. Genesis 12:1-3 (NIV)
